Learning Target:	How can we use both story clues and what we already know to predict what might happen next in the story?	Materials:	<i>Now One Foot, Now the Other</i> by Tommy de Paola
Key Vocabulary:	Prediction, bones, muscles	Technology Connection:	

Engage Now: <i>Opening</i>	Begin lesson by reviewing what we mean by prediction: when we make a prediction, we take information from the story and combine it with our own knowledge and experiences to figure out what might happen next.
Teach Now: <i>Mini Lesson</i>	Introduce the book <i>Now One Foot, Now the Other</i> to the class. Read aloud a few pages of the book. Stop at a place where you can make a prediction. Talk through what you already know that could help you determine what might happen next. Record this information on the left column of the T-chart. Make a prediction and record it on the right side of the T-chart. Continue reading to determine whether the prediction was accurate. Model this process several times using the T-chart. Then guide students through this same process. When appropriate, have students offer as many viable possibilities as they can generate. Emphasize that the information they use can come from a book, their own experiences, or their own knowledge.
Explore Now: <i>Independent Practice</i>	Students complete an organizer at his or her own skill level on prediction with books provided by the teacher.

Closing:

Students return to carpet and turn and talk about their predictions and if they were accurate.
