Interview a producer. Don't forget to ask them questions such as "What is the name of the business you work in?", "Do you provide a good or a service?", or "Why did you choose this job?" (5 pts.)

Find an example of something that demonstrates scarcity. (Not having enough resources to meet everyone's needs.) Does your picture show scarcity of man-made goods, natural resources, human resources, or financial resources? (5 pts.)

Create a commercial persuading people to visit our city. Be sure to use comedy or persuasive words to entertain and persuade your audience. Don't forget to include reasons why people should visit our city. Tell them about all of the great businesses that are located here. Be creative! (10 pts.)

Select one specific business located in our city. Create a commercial persuading people to visit that business. Be sure to use comedy or persuasive words to entertain and persuade your audience. Don't forget to include reasons why people should buy their goods or services. Be creative! (10 pts.)

Create a song or skit that teaches one or more of our economic concepts/ vocabulary words. (currency, goods, services, producers, consumers, needs, wants, spending, saving, scarcity) For example, you can make up your own money song, act out a skit where someone is a producer providing a service to a consumer, or create a song explaining scarcity. Be creative! (10 pts.)
